The Practices of Naming Places

- **The Hungarian National Toponym Registry** (Hoffmann 2022)
- Importance of place-naming:
 - formation of **personal and community identity**
 - **cultural and political significance**
- **Unique sources for various disciplines** like linguistics, ethnography, history, archaeology, or geography
- Street-naming practices in Hungary: *Iskola utca* ('School Street'), *Templom utca* ('Church Street'), *Piac tér* ('Market Square'), *Múzeum körút* ('Museum Boulevard'), *Alsó utca* ('Lower Street'), *Határ út* ('Boundary Road')

Official Names of Public Spaces

- **Preserving earlier microtoponyms:** Árendás utca ('Tenant Street'); Szérűskert utca ('Threshing Floor Garden Street'); Szénáskert ('Haygarden'); Eperföld ('Strawberry Field'); Szőlőkköze ('Lane of Grapes')



Survival and Disappearance of Toponyms

- Tied to the **community** which uses it
- Survival and change of a toponym:
 - *Martonháza > Mrtáz ~ Mrtháza ~ Mrtáza > Mártaháza*



Survival and Disappearance of Toponyms

- Factors in **disappearance** of a toponym:
 - destruction of the denotatum (the physical place)
 - changes in its function
- **Medieval settlements were vanished** during the Ottoman Turkish occupation – still retaining some names




Name of a wasteland: *Régi templomhely* 'old church site' (T1)



Survival and Disappearance of Toponyms

- **Environmental changes** (the *Danube* and smaller watercourses)




Survival and Disappearance of Toponyms

- In the outskirts: **changes in the use of a land**
 - *Ökörjáró* ('ox-walker') → *Röptér* ('airport')

Survival and Disappearance of Toponyms

- In the outskirts: **changes in the use of a land**
 - *Szes ~ Sesz* ('flat land') → *Tocsilósza*



'We Are in The Twenty-Fourth Hour'

- The urgency of gathering data from **living sources**
- Microtoponyms are particularly at **risk of disappearing**
- Names of smaller geographic features (plots of land, hills, and ponds etc.) **are rarely recorded in official documents**





The Hungarian National Toponym Registry (MNHP)

- large-scale, national toponym collection project
- with universities in the Carpathian Basin
- on the entire Hungarian-speaking region within and around the Carpathian Basin, including Moldva
- analyze historical data and interviews





The Hungarian National Toponym Registry (MNHP)

- Sources of the names and information
- texts from fieldwork
- modern publications
 - (such as books, maps, digital databases, and media content),
- historical printed materials
- data archives
- hand-drawn maps
- charters
- manuscripts
- other materials from previous toponym collections or related research





The Hungarian National Toponym Registry (MNHP)



- Collected data and information types
 - names (with all variants)
 - source
 - date
 - location of the denotatum (with coordinates)
 - etymological informations
 - informations about the place
 - any associated sayings, legends, or anecdotes



The outcomes of the collection and processing work



- dictionaries (with accompanying maps)
 - in both digital and printed formats
 - searchable online annotated name database
 - online interactive map


